FAU receives \$20,000 gift to aid Keith and Schnars fund

Florida Atlantic University's College of Engineering and Computer Science and the College of Architecture, Urban and Public Affairs have received a \$20,000 gift from the firm of Keith and Schnars, P.A., a multi-disciplinary consulting firm.

The Keith and Schnars Scholarship Fund was originally established in 2004 for the College of Engineering and Computer Science with a gift of \$30,000. The new gift embraces both colleges by providing financial assistance to one

civil engineering or geomatics engineering major, as well as one urban and regional planning major each year.

"We consider FAU a major asset in the South Florida community and an important part of the region's economic, cultural and environmental future," said Michael Davis, vice president of Keith and Schnars and an FAU Foundation Board member.

To qualify for the scholarship, candidates must be either a junior or senior, sustain a strong cumulative grade point average and demonstrate active participation and leadership skills.
